

**1on1 Milwaukee Summer League**  
**5<sup>th</sup>/6B Grade**  
**Rules and Notes**

1. Coaches need to put their player's numbers in the score book at the scorer's table before each game.
2. Each team must provide a timer or scorer for each game.
3. Two 18-minute halves, running clock. The clock will stop in the last one minute of each half. Each game will have two officials.  
~~**Two timeouts per game.**
4. Pressing Rules:  
    Pressing only in the last 1 minute of the game.
4. Overtime will be sudden death, the first team that scores, wins. No time outs.
5. **Free throws:** Players will shoot from the shorter line provided and will be allowed to land over the line. Players will not be allowed to "chase" their rebounds. Last year players were being instructed to shoot and then "chase" after the rebound. Please don't teach this as it will not work when they get older. It's a bad habit. If the rebound comes back to the shooter it will be allowed. Again, my refs will monitor and make the decision if it was forced or just happened.
6. **NEW:** players may leave on the release for free throws. WIAA Rule  
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7. If teams have the same color uniforms, pennies will be provided.
8. No forfeits are allowed, and NO schedule changes will be made unless approved by Mary Nellen  
    If your team is going to be short players on any given night, call or email Mary
9. Sportsmanship is a must. We will not tolerate yelling at referees or trash talking by anyone. Supervisors have the right to eject any coach, player, parent, or team who is abusive.
10. Please be on time for all games.
11. Concessions will be provided
12. Please clean up the bench area after your game!
13. Teams must provide their own warmup balls.

**\*\*Note to coaches.**

I am not instilling a "must play man to man" rule, but highly recommend it. It is essential for any player planning to play at the next level to learn it, and it is your responsibility as a youth coach to teach it.... It is the cornerstone of any defense they will ever play! Please don't underestimate the ability of a girl to learn.
